- The Herb S. Breier Instructor of the Year Award is open to a volunteer or professional ARRL Amateur Radio instructor who is creative in teaching and who demonstrates the highest value in pursuit of our great radio service. Nomination deadline is March 15 for 2012.
- The Hiram Percy Maxim Award is open to an ARRL member under age 21for contributions to and accomplishments in Amateur Radio. Nomination deadline is March 31 for 2012.
- The ARRL Microwave Development Award is available to one or more licensed Amateur Radio operators who contribute to the development of microwave communications. Deadline is March 31 for 2012.
- The ARRL Technical Service Award. Open to one or more Amateur Radio licensees who provide technical assistance or training to others. Deadline is March 31, 2012.
- The ARRL Technical Innovation Award. Granted to one or more licensed radio amateurs who develop or apply new technical approaches in Amateur Radio. Deadline is March 31, 2012.

Question: I have been looking into some Ham Radio contesting recently and saw something called IOTA. What is that? Thanks.

Answer: Islands On The Air (IOTA) was created in 1964 by a Shortwave DX listener in Wales named Geoff

Watts. Watts' original goal was for Shortwave listeners to look for, record, and receive QSL confirmation from islands around the world. In 1985 the Radio Society of Great Britain (RSGB) took continued page 5

January 24, 2012 - ARRL & CQ Sign Agreement to Provide ARRL's Logbook of The World Support for CQ's Awards

(Hicksville, NY and Newington, CT - Jan. 24, 2012) – CQ Communications, Inc. (CQ) and ARRL – the national association for Amateur Radio, have signed an agreement to begin providing support for CQ-sponsored operating awards by the ARRL's Logbook of the World (LoTW) electronic confirmation system. The agreement was announced jointly today by ARRL Chief Operating Officer Harold Kramer, WJ1B, and CQ Communications President Richard Ross, K2MGA.

CQ's awards will be the first non-ARRL awards supported by LoTW and will be phased in, beginning with the CQ WPX award. Additional CQ awards will follow. The ARRL's LoTW system, an interactive database recording contacts between radio amateurs was created in 2003 and has been adopted by 47,500 radio "hams" worldwide. It already has records of 400 million contacts and grows weekly. The target date for beginning LoTW support for WPX is April 1, 2012. Amateurs will be able to use LoTW logs to generate lists of confirmed contacts to be submitted for WPX credit. Standard LoTW credit fees and CQ award fees will apply.

ARRL Chief Executive Officer David Sumner, K1ZZ, observed that this step gives radio amateurs throughout the world an inexpensive and convenient means of gaining credits toward CQ's popular operating awards. "LoTW has significantly increased interest and participation in the ARRL's DXCC, Worked All States and VUCC awards programs. We anticipate a similarly positive response to the addition of the CQ WPX award. Amateurs will be able to spend more time operating and less time chasing QSL cards."

CQ President Richard Ross, K2MGA, said he is very pleased to be able to move forward with Logbook support for CQ awards. "We have had excellent results with electronic confirmations for several years," he said, "and I am glad that we are now able to begin expanding that convenience to those participants in our award programs who use Logbook of the World. We look forward to a smooth launch for WPX, and to the expansion of LoTW support to include the rest of our award programs as well."

NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY



NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

Scammers have been making phone calls claiming to represent the National Do Not Call Registry. The calls claim to provide an opportunity to sign up for the Registry. These calls are not coming from the Registry or the Federal Trade

Commission, and you should not respond to these calls. To add your number to the Registry you can call 888-382-1222 from the phone you wish to register, or go click on "Register a Phone Number" in the left column of this page: https://www.donotcall.gov/

Your registration will not expire. Telephone numbers placed on the National Do Not Call Registry will remain on it permanently due to the Do-Not-Call Improvement Act of 2007, which became law in February 2008. Read more about it at http://www.ftc.gov/opa/2008/04/dncfyi.shtm.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT THE NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

The National Do Not Call Registry gives you a choice about whether to receive telemarketing calls at home. Most telemarketers should not call your number once it has been on the registry for 31 days. If they do, you can file a complaint at this Website. You can register your home or mobile phone for free.

on the management of IOTA to encourage contact with island stations around the world in a two-way manner. The objective, as stated by the RSGB, is "for the island chaser, is to make radio contact with at least one counter in as many of these groups as possible and, for the DXpeditioner, to provide such island contacts".

To assist the SWLs and active amateur radio DXers "The oceans" islands have been grouped into some 1200 'IOTA groups' with, for reasons of geography, varying numbers of "counters", i.e. qualifying islands, in each" according to the RSGB. Various groups throughout the world organize DXpeditions to remote islands so amateur radio operators can be the "contact station" for that island. You can only imagine the challenges on these very small spots of land in the middle of a lot of water. If you are looking for more information on IOTA and DXpeditions go to: http://www.rsgbiota.org/index.php. You do not have to be an RSGB member to access this site. Who knows...you too may be an island DXpeditioner one day.
